COMMUNITY

Define the geographic community of concern. Use geographic units in which data is commonly presented (NM Small Areas, Census Tracts, County)

INDICATORS

Define the characteristics, the issues, the problem you want to explore, along with the resources, assets (or services and programs) that address the issues. How will you measure these things? How will you present them on maps or in tables?

STORY

How will you narrate the interplay of community with problems and resources? What do you hope to say? What judgements or meanings does the data lead to?

AUDIENCE

Who are the intended recipients of the story? How does their knowledge about local people, problems and programs inform the story? How will they explore the data and their collective knowledge to come to conclusions and . .

ACTION

What action(s) have the community participants decided to engage in? What comes first? What comes next?

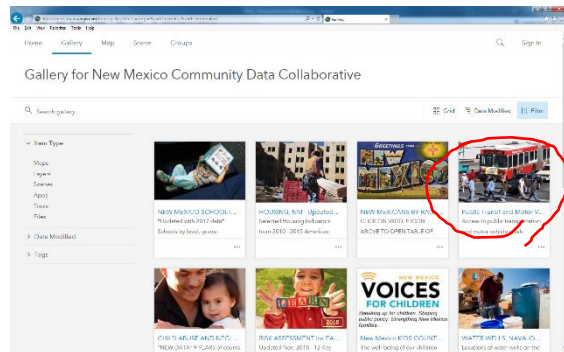

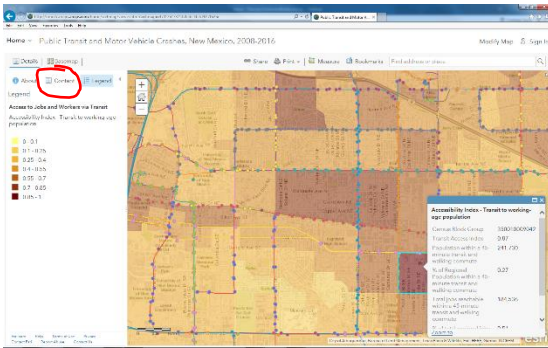


1. CLICK ON "GALLERY" TO FIND LOTS OF MAPS

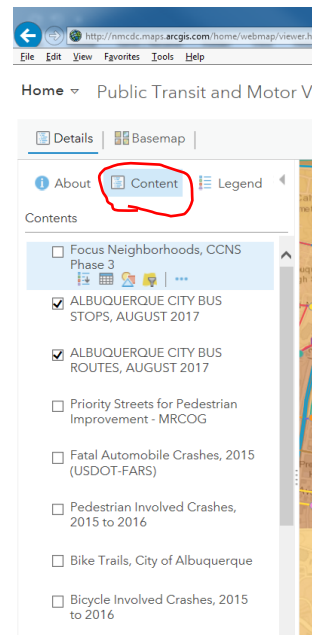
2. SCROLL, READ THE DESCRIPTIONS, PICK A MAP
